



2 Tablespoons cornstarch
2/3 cup water
1 1/2 cups fresh cranberries, rinsed and drained
Pastry for 2 crust pie
1 jar mincemeat
1 egg yolk mixed with 2 Tablespoons water

Directions

In sauce pan combine sugar and cornstarch, add water. Over high heat cook and stir to boiling. Add cranberries and continue to boil. Reduce heat simmer 5-10 minutes - stir occasionally. Place mincemeat into one of pasrty lined pie plates and top with cranberry mixture. Cover with 2nd pie crust - flute edges, cut slits to vent. Brush egg mixture over crust. Bake 425 degrees F for 30 minutes or until golden brown.

Shoo Fly Pie

Ingredients: Nine inch pie shell

Crumb Mixture
3/4 cup flour
1/2 tsp salt
1/2/tsp cinnamon
1/2 tsp ginger
1/8 tsp nutmeg
1/8 tsp ground cloves
1/2 cup brown sugar
2 Tablespoons shortening

Liquid Mixture 1/2 cup dark molasses 3/4 cup boiling water 1 egg, well beaten 1/2 tsp baking soda

Line a 9-inch pie plate with shell. Combine ingredients of Crumb Mixture using hand or pastry blender. Combine Liquid Mixture Ingredients and pour into pie shell. Top with crumb mixture. Bake at 400 degrees F until starts to brown - about 10 minutes. Reduce heat to 325. Bake until firm.
